With a bedroom (with possible additional bed) and a large living room with a French sofa bed, the Loft can accommodate up to 5 people. - Upon arrival you will be asked for an identification document, including minors, for electronic communication to the prefecture.
- Only residents can access the facility and its services.
- From 10.30 pm to 8.00 am, customers are asked to observe appropriate behavior to ensure that guests' rest is not disturbed.
- Animals are not allowed
- WIFI connection, bed linen, towels and final cleaning are included in the price.
- Smoking is strictly prohibited inside the rooms and the structure. Smoking is permitted in the open spaces in the courtyard.
- We have in our Guest House, a paid service of coffee shop, aperitifs, craft beers, drinks, etc., for guests only from 7.30 to 10.30 am. and from 4.00 pm to 7.00 pm

- If you need to hang out or wash some laundry, please let us know and we will provide you with the necessary service.
- All areas of the Guest House (TV Living area, sofa, common table, darts area, library, board games, etc.) are at your disposal in sharing with other guests. The only part reserved for staff is the kitchen/reception area.
- It is possible to use the tea kettle in the common area in front of the rooms and consume your take-away dishes or pizza at the table in the breakfast room; let us know and we will provide you with plates, cutlery and glasses.
- If you love vinyl records you can listen to them freely and if you love the guitar you can use the Music Room from 4.00 pm to 7.30 pm by asking us for the keys

SACRA DI SAN MICHELE

The Val di Susa, located between Turin and the French Alps, is characterized by a vast archaeological, architectural, military, spiritual, artistic and cultural heritage; the entire valley is dotted with villages, villages, castles, forts, medieval abbeys, charterhouses, testimony to its rich history marked by the passage of numerous armies, merchants, pilgrims and important historical figures. It is an ideal destination for walking and trekking thanks to the presence of both several protected Alpine natural parks and the Via Francigena, a religious walking itinerary that crosses the entire Susa Valley from France to continue up to Rome. In Val di Susa you can also practice numerous sports: cycling, mountain biking, downhill, climbing, via ferratas, mountain running, canoeing, rafting, alpine skiing and ski touring, snowshoeing excursions, etc.

In this welcome book you will find some of the countless proposals for visiting the most evocative places and discovering nature, parks, lakes, through walking and trekking.

LOCAL DAY TRIP

SACRA DI SAN MICHELE

Very ancient abbey built between 983 and 987 on the top of Mount Pirchiriano. From the top of its towers you can admire the Piedmontese capital and a breathtaking panorama of the Val di Susa.

A symbolic monument of Piedmont, the imposing sanctuary is one of the most important religious architectures in the area, as well as one of the main places of Michaelic worship in Italy and Europe.

SUSA

Jewel of the Cozie Alps, Susa is the tourist hub of the entire Valley; rich in Roman and medieval monuments, including the Arch of Augustus, the Porta Savoia, the aqueduct, the Amphitheatre, the medieval castle, the imposing cathedral of San Giusto, the church of San Francesco and the church of the Bridge, home to the Diocesan Museum of Alpine Religious Art. Susa is also a lively commercial town which in the summer period comes alive in its historic center which offers numerous shops, bars and restaurants.

ABBAZIA DI NOVALESA

Not far from the characteristic village of Novalesa is the Benedictine Abbey of SS. Pietro and Andrea, founded in 726; it is one of the oldest abbeys in the entire western Alpine arc and has always been an important pilgrimage route, becoming an important stop on the Via Francigena. Inside the complex you can admire various works such as the significant frescoed cycles depicting scenes from the life of S. Eldrado and S. Nicola; In the complex we also find an Archaeological Museum.

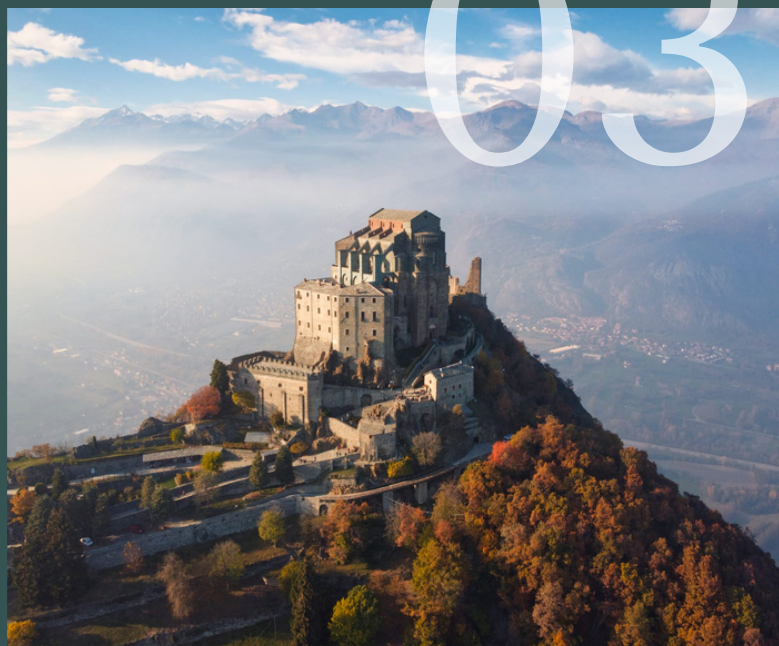

LAGHI DI AVIGLIANA

Located 20 km. from Turin and at the foot of Mount Pirchiriano, the Avigliana Lakes Natural Park is a natural oasis of extraordinary beauty. The walk that surrounds the shores of the two lakes of Avigliana is really simple and offers enchanting views in every season of the year due to its colors and uncontaminated nature, all enriched by the beautiful view of the Sacra di San Michele and the medieval town of Avigliana, dominated by the remains of the ancient castle.

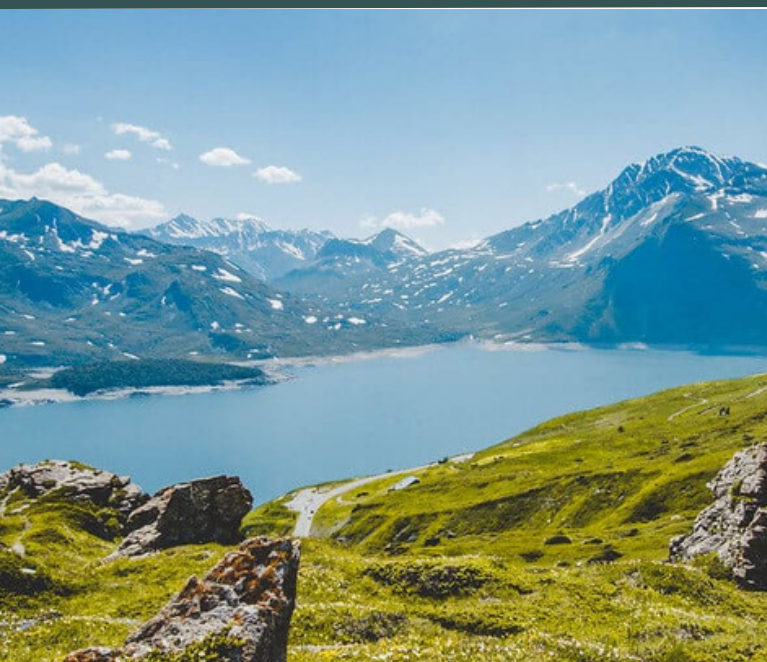


IL FORTE DI EXILLES

The Exilles Fort is one of the oldest monuments and defensive systems in Piedmont, together with the fortified complex of Fenestrelle. Decidedly evocative and with a strong visual impact, it consists of two permanent museum areas and offers two guided tours characterized by the scenic settings of the artist Richi Ferrero.

LAGO DEL MONCENISIO

Going up the state road, after the last bend, on a day with clear skies, your heart suddenly opens in front of a celestial panorama. An expanse of water, sparkling with a thousand flashes and an intense turquoise, as far as the eye can see. Lake Mont Cenis, which extends along the pass that divides Italy from France at 2000 meters above sea level, almost seems like a small "sea". Once at the hill, go in search of the ancient submerged hospice, the pyramid, the military forts and the numerous mountain pastures that sell delicious cheeses.

FIXED ROPE ROUTE - MTB E-BIKE

The Susa Valley is the ideal place for trekking, free climbing, mountain climbing, fixed rope route, winter sports, etc. Listing all the routes is impossible, just think that only the "Sentiero Balcone", one of the most beautiful trekking routes in Val di Susa, unfolds in 10 stages, for a total of 250 km!! So here you will find a small selection especially of nearby routes. Obviously most of the treks can also be done by MTB or E-bike.

AMPRIMO REFUGE (1385 MT.)

TOESCA REFUGE (1710 MT.)

Very easy trekking for everyone, even children, up to the Amprimo refuge, 40 minute walk. You can continue up to the Toesca refuge.

In this case 1.30 hour walk from the start.

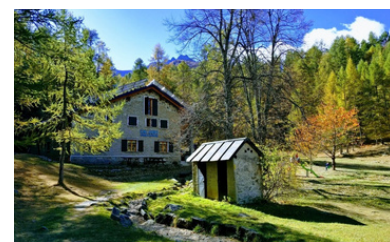

TREKKING AND FIXED ROPE ROUTE

You can get to the Sacra di San Michele with a walk, starting at the foot of Mount Pirchiriano, from the town of Chiusa San Michele or Sant'Ambrogio. The circular route is easy but quite challenging in terms of altitude (600 mt.)

There is also a fixed rope route, called "Carlo Giorda".

It starts from Sant'Ambrogio. Duration 4 hours.

TOUR OF THE THREE REFUGES AMPRIMO, TOESCA, VAL GRAVIO

In the heart of the Orsiera Rocciavrè Park, the Giro dei Tre Rifugi is a circular route that allows you to travel along ancient mule tracks between mountain settlements made up of typical stone buildings.

Each stage can be taken as a standalone, depending on your ability and preparation. The first stage is an easy route for families that leads to the Amprimo refuge; the second stage is a pleasant walk a little more demanding due to the difference in altitude, which from the Amprimo refuge leads to the Toesca refuge, passing through Alpe Balmetta along path 510. The third stage is decidedly more demanding and requires good physical preparation: from the Toesca refuge you climb towards the middle alp along path 510 to continue along path 511 up to Porta del Villano at an altitude of 2507 m. From here you descend into the Gravio valley at an altitude of 1376 m. The last stage is a pleasant and easy walk from Val Gravio back to the starting point.

Length: 18 Km. - Altitude difference: 1330 mt. Walking time: 7/8 Hour

ROCCIAMELONE (3538 MT.)

Rocciamelone is the Val Susa excursion par excellence. The climb to Rocciamelone is something unique. In fact, there are few excursions that allow you to reach a peak of 3538 meters without "too much technical difficulty". Of course we are still in the high mountains and being aware of it is a must, but this trek is truly suitable for all trained people.

The simplest and most well-known route is the one that starts from the car park under the La Riposa refuge at an altitude of 2050 metres.

From Bussoleno to start of the trek 50 minutes - 25 Km.

The last kilometers of the road are dirt and quite bumpy

Length: 10 Km. Round trip - Altitude difference: 1488 mt.

Climbing time: 3/4 Hour

BORGONE DI SUSA - ROCA FURÀ

In Borgone di Susa, a few kilometers from Bussoleno, you can find several well-signposted routes which pass through woods rich in legends, abandoned villages, old uncultivated vineyards and evidence of ancient crafts.

One of these is a route that leads to the Roca Furà cave, a trek of medium difficulty with some passages of high difficulty if you want to climb up to the cave, a passage that can be avoided in any case.

VIA FRANCIGENA VAL SUSA

The Via Francigena allows us to contemplate memorable landscapes step by step, following the mule tracks and mountain paths, the dirt roads of the valley floor and even the fields, retracing the steps of the many pilgrims who preceded us.

Today it is possible to retrace that itinerary either on foot or by bicycle with more or less demanding sections for over 170 km.

Every year the Via Francigena Marathon takes place, a 42 km route from Avigliana to Susa. On Wikiloc you can find the route that can also be done by avoiding the climb to the Sacra di San Michele.

MTB - EBIKE - BIKE PARK

Mountain biking and e-bikes are certainly the best ways to discover these mountains which offer many dirt routes, including mule tracks, paths and military roads (see the high altitude military roads section below). In the upper valley, in Bardonecchia and Sauxe d'Oulx, you will also find downhill bike parks, as well as several specialized shops for MTB and E-bike rental.

Cycle track Francigena Valle Susa

The Susa Valley opens from the Turin plain towards the Mont Cenis and Monginevro passes, historic connections between Europe and northern Italy. Along the road axis that has characterized the valley since Roman times, a new route unraveled in the Middle Ages and the birth of small characteristic villages along the road and the Dora Riparia. It is here that the cycle route takes shape, retracing the ancient route of the Ancient Road of France, alternating the itinerary between meadows and cultivated fields and pleasant wooded areas. In the overall project, the Ciclovia Francigena passes through 15 municipalities up to Colle del Moncenisio, the first 35 km which go up from the valley floor to the halfway point are now passable, and passes through villages with ancient history, alongside castles and parish churches dominated from above by the majestic Abbey of Sacra di San Michele.

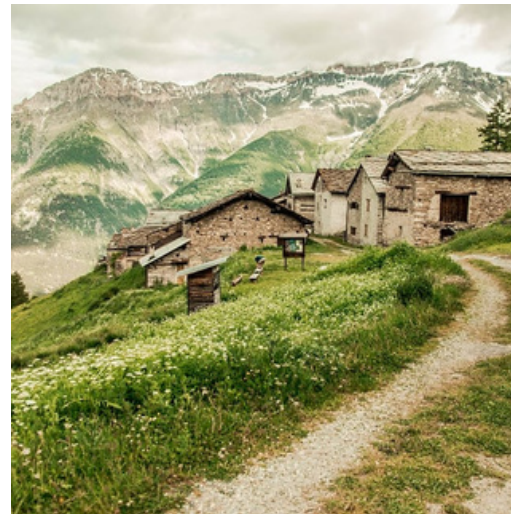
The historic center and lakes of Avigliana are worth a detour from the main route.

HIGH ALTITUDE MILITARY ROADS

MOTORBIKES AND MTB



The Susa Valley is a paradise for motorbike and MTB enthusiasts. Because here alone there are almost 800 kilometers of military roads, with hairpin bends to take in breathtaking views that reach up to 3,000 meters above sea level. The three main itineraries are:

1 COLLE DELLE FINESTRE – STRADA DELL'ASSIETTA

The climb that leads from Susa to Colle delle Finestre is considered hors categories, extremely demanding and has one of the highest difficulty coefficients in the ranking of European climbs. It's 18,7km long, with a climb of 1692m with a medium gradient of 9% and 33 hairpins!!

The ASSIETTA ROAD it is the longest high-altitude ridge road in the Alps, and is subject to seasonal opening in the period May-November. It presents numerous fortresses along its route that date back to different historical eras. The dirt road surface can be traveled by motorbike, car, mountain bike and on foot. The route starts from Pian dell'Alpe (Usseaux) and reaches Sestriere after about 30 kilometres. It runs almost entirely above 2,000 m.

From Bussoleno to Sestriere (Colle Finestre and Assietta Road) 63 km.

HIGH ALTITUDE MILITARY ROADS

MOTORBIKES AND MTB

2 BARDONECCHIA - SOMMEILLER HILL

Sommeiller hill (2993 m, 9,819 ft) is one of Europe's highest mountain pass and it's considered the bikers "Europe's roof". It's a wonderful "adventure road" from Bardonecchia to Sommeiller hill, a carriage road open to traffic but opened for a limited period that changes every year according to weather conditions, normally from the end of July until the first autumn snowfall. Starting from Bardonecchia, the rise is 26,3 km with a climb of 1711 mt. The average percentage is 6,5% with maximum gradient of 19%. The asphalted part of Sommeiller hill it's only 20% of the entire route and it runs until Rochemolles, after 6km. The last kilometers of climb to reach SOMMEILLER HILL are the hardest but the most amazing thanks to the the wonderful surrounding Alps view. Immediately after the pass the french border is found ; the dirt road continues after the parking alongside a little lake but it is allow only on foot or bike, a few minutes walking and you can reach 3009m.

From Bussoleno to Sommeiller Hill - 63 km.



3 EXILLES - FORTE PRAMAND - GALLERIA DEI SARACENI

The "Military Road 79", as it was classified by the Italian Army, is a magnificent dirt road along which there are numerous fortifications and military works. The road culminates at the JAFFERAU FORT at 2,805 meters above sea level, with a length of 20 km. The real jewel and main feature of this road is the spectacular PRAMAND TUNNEL, also known as the SARACEN TUNNEL, 876 meters long and dug in a curve under the spiers of Mount Seguret between the two Great Wars.

The main activity for which Val di Susa is popular in winter is certainly alpine skiing, together with ski touring and snowshoeing. Here you will find among the most famous ski area in Piedmont such as Sestriere and Bardonecchia, where the Winter Olympics took place in 2006.

ALPINE SKIING

BARDONECCHIA

A skiing paradise, Bardonecchia offers winter sports lovers 100 km of slopes, 23 ski lifts, a snow park, the Olympic half pipe, a cross-country track, snow tubing and an ice skating rink. In summer Bardonecchia turns into the ideal place for downhill, MTB, Ebike and trekking.



SESTRIERE, VIA LATTEA

The "Via Lattea" ski area offers approximately 400 km of slopes connected to each other with numerous ski lifts that connect the ski resorts of Sestriere, Cesana Torinese, San Sicario, Claviere.



SKI TOURING - SNOWSHOEING

With over 150 itineraries differing in difficulty, difference in altitude and length, the Val di Susa is a perfect destination for both expert and beginner ski mountaineers as well as snowshoers. TURIN

Savoy bastion par excellence, former capital of the Kingdom of Italy, Turin is a lively and elegant city, always on the move, surrounded by greenery, with over 300 km of tree-lined avenues and countless parks. Gently leaning against the hills and embraced by the course of the Po, it owes much of its charm to its history and enchanting geographical position at the foot of the western Alps. Ancient cradle of the Risorgimento. culture, art, history, sport, industry and good food: the Piedmontese capital is certainly one of the Italian destinations that a tourist cannot miss, full of hidden treasures, crossed by French echoes and beautiful to visit at any time of the year. In Turin, historical monuments, museums, art galleries, exhibition halls, distinctive architecture, squares, parks, suggestive corners and historic cafés await you in a concentration of uniqueness waiting to be discovered and in which to relive some of the most important historical moments of the city.

HOW TO GET TO TURIN

From Bussoleno to get to the center of Turin it takes about an hour by car depending on traffic. Parking in Turin can be complicated, especially if you want to leave your car in central areas where the ZTL is active. However, there are several paid car parks near the centre. Our advice is to arrive in Turin by train which takes you to the center in 40/50 minutes. Trains leave from Bussoleno station every hour. Consult the Trenitalia website or inquire directly at the train station.

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SUPERGA

The Basilica of Superga is located in one of the highest and most panoramic points of the Turin hill at 669 meters above sea level. Designed and built by Filippo Juvarra in 1717-1731, it is dedicated to the Nativity of Mary and houses the tombs of the House of Savoy. It was erected in this place by choice of Duke Vittorio Amedeo II of Savoy, so that it could be visible from the whole city and was visually connected and aligned, along the axis of the "Strada di Rivoli" (now Corso Francia), with the Royal Palace of Turin and with the Castello di Rivoli. The church, with a circular plan, is dominated by a 75 meter high dome and flanked by two 60 meter high bell towers. An imposing pronaos with eight Corinthian columns precedes the façade. Inside, the stucco decoration and the marble of the altars and the floor create spectacular light effects. The main altar, whose frame was designed by Filippo Juvarra, is enriched by a marble bas-relief by Bernardino Cametti which recalls the glorious battle for the liberation of Turin.

The church and the chapel of the vote are places intended for prayer, entry is free. Visits to the Royal Tombs and Royal Apartment are subject to charges. For more information visit the site.

How to get there:

You can reach the Basilica square directly by car (about an hour from Bussoleno)
Or you can park at the foot of the hill in Stazione Sassi and choose whether to take the Tramway to Dentiera, or go up on foot along the various paths on the hill which allow you to follow a circular route. Difference in height approximately 500 m.
Time: 2 hours for the climb.

LA REGGIA DI VENARIA

The Royal Palace of Venaria is certainly one of the largest and most beautiful Savoy residences. Imposing, sumptuous, his project was taken up again for the construction of the palace par excellence, that of Versailles. The Royal Palace of Venaria has been part of the UNESCO world heritage site since 1997.

The complex, of which the palace is part, is made up of approximately 80,000 m² of walkable land, including the park and the historic village of Venaria. Since 2007, after eight years of restoration, the splendid gardens of the palace complex of Venaria represent the flagship of this magnificent building with the spaces of the English Gardens, that of Flowers and Roses, and the grove area.

The axis that connects the various areas - that is to say the immense avenues, ornaments and gardens - is approximately 2 kilometers long, and therefore constitutes an unmissable route for all lovers of open air activities who do not want to give up an immersion in the refinement of times gone by.

After visiting the interiors of the palace of Venaria, and after having stopped in particular in the magnificent Diana Gallery, the advice is to take a walk in the lush gardens. You can do this by getting on a romantic horse-drawn carriage, or admiring them from another perspective by taking a boat ride along the small lake which is an integral part of the park. The little ones also have access to a little train that winds through the most beautiful corners and places of the Venaria park.



HOW TO GET TO THE REGGIA DI VENARIA

If you have a car you can easily get to the Reggia di Venaria by taking the Turin North ring road and exiting at Venaria or Savonera/Venaria. To park there are: the Castellamonte and Carlo Emanuele II car parks. From loft 29 to the Reggia di Venaria by car, 40 minutes - 46 km



If you don't have a car you can reach the Reggia di Venaria with Venaria Express from Turin. The shuttle service can be taken both in Piazza Vittorio Veneto and in Piazza Castello.
